

--I had a long conversation with Dr. Riboldi recently concerning our WEH Academy that offers academic courses for your Jr. and High Schoolers. So many exciting things happening! It is thriving and growing. Our students are loving it.

Last fall, we had about 500 families in the WEH Academy community. It has now grown to over 2200 families which means we feel confident moving forward and offering more classes. Our dream is that there will be enough students that many of your high schoolers can find friends nearby to do the classes with and not feel so isolated. We know how important good friends are at that age.

We will continue to offer previous classes in Algebra, Geometry, Biology, Anatomy/Physiology with Dr. Riboldi, Physics, Spanish I, 5000 Year Leap, Story of Liberty with Ruel Haymond, Digital art with Kristell Fox, Innovations with Trent Merrell, World Geography with Allen Powell, Leadership with Andy Haymond, Ty Crossley will teach Literature, Sam Beeson will again offer English basic composition and Juan Riboldi will teach entrepreneurship. In addition to these classes, we have new teachers to introduce you to and among the new classes are:

Pre-algebra, Spanish 2, American Govt/Economics, US History, the Family, Watercolor and other art course, a computer programming course, WWII literature and history, a practical engineering course, World Religions, the Hero Cycle in Literature, Classic Romance, Chemistry, College Preparation, Creative writing, and possibly a Research Paper course.

These courses are free from some of the liberal agendas found in many schools. Faith is welcome. There is no pressure. A child can learn what he is ready to learn. The atmosphere is positive and supportive. Not competitive. There are no tests unless just to allow a student to see where he's at. Our teachers are familiar with the WEH philosophy of learning.

We'll have artful living experiences to enjoy or just come and visit with other women.
